Population Health

Biostatistics

Biostatistics covers the basic concepts around descriptive and inferential statistical methods. Topics include exploratory data analysis, central tendency, variability, score standardization, and the logic of hypothesis testing. The course also covers intermediate statistical concepts including analysis of variance (ANOVA) with planned comparisons and post-hoc tests, factorial ANOVA, bivariate linear correlation and regression, the chi-square tests for goodness of fit and association, the Mann-Whitney U test, and the essentials of sample size estimation.








The percentage of chief academic officers who believe their faculty accepts the value and legitimacy of online education has not increased




The percentage of chief academic leaders who say online learning is critical to their long-term strategy is at a new high
